- Why is it wonderful to be a son of God?
 - According to 4:1-5, 7?

 - According to 4:6?

- How does Paul describe the work of the Son (4:4-5, 7)? What is true about Jesus, according to these verses? What is true about the work of Jesus?

- How does Paul describe the work of the Spirit (4:6)?
- Is adoption something you *Re]R_V]FR* as well as *b[OR`a]Q* If not, how can you meditate on the Son's work more? How can you ask the Spirit to work on your heart and affections more?
- When we don't feel joyful as Christians, or loved by God, what do we need to do?
- When are you most in danger of living as a slave, not a son?
- How should adoption address issues in your relationship with God, such as anxiety, trust, guilt/shame, and prayer?
- How should adoption address issues in your relationship with others, such as a desire for approval, the ability to receive criticism, teachability, and complaining/bitterness?
