



Community Group Study: Grace Grows Godliness
Titus - Part 1 | Titus 1:1-4 | week of September 10

GETTING STARTED

- If you could only use one or two words to describe yourself, what word(s) would you choose?

Read Titus 1:1-4.

DISCUSS & APPLY

- How does Paul describe himself (verse 1)? What is significant about his description?
- How does Paul describe Titus (verse 4)? What is significant about that description?
- What do verses 1-2 tell us about Paul's aim in his ministry?
- How does God make his eternal purposes known (verse 3)?

- Paul describes Christians as “God’s elect” - God’s chosen people. Why might the truth of God’s election discourage us from evangelism?
- **Read Acts 18:5-11.** What effect did knowing God had “many in this city who were [his] people” have on Paul?
- How does God’s election actually encourage evangelism?
- Why is evangelism eternally significant? How does this help us overcome our fears and do it?
- Why are gospel churches the most important places in a town?
- The truth is that what we do for the gospel today has eternal implications. How does this excite you? How should it change your priorities for your week?

NEXT STEPS

- Spend some time in prayer this week thanking God for revealing the truth of the gospel to you. Ask him to give you boldness in sharing the gospel, reminding you that and making you bold because many in our town are “his people” (see Acts 18:9-10).
