 - 3. Matthew 26:67; John 19:1-2
 - C. "We" are those whose iniquities were laid on Him 53:6
 - 1. Readily
 - 2. Recklessly
 - 3. Ungratefully
 - 4. Self-willfully

 - 5. Will those for whom Jesus paid sin's penalty ever be required to pay the penalty themselves? Why or why not? Will those whose iniquities were laid on Jesus ever have to bear those iniquities? Why or why not?
 - 6. How does the reality of what Jesus has done as described in Isaiah 53:3-6 affect you? To what response does it lead you?
