Solus Christus: Christ Alone

Philippians 3:7-11 | Phil Wuthrich

<u>Thesis</u>: Embracing the reformation doctrine of "Christ Alone" as our Gospel-given identity is foundational to our rejoicing and standing firm in the Lord.

I. How must the Gospel form our identity?

- A. Christ alone is counted as our gain. (7-8)
 - i. Gaining Christ makes everything else seem like loss.
 - ii. Gaining Christ is worth losing everything else.
- B. Christ alone is the source of our righteousness. (9)
 - i. Righteousness defined in relation to God.
 - ii. Righteousness dependent on relationship with God.
- C. Christ alone is the aim of our life. (10-11)
 - i. Know Christ by the power of His resurrection.
 - ii. Know Christ through partnership in His sufferings.
 - iii. Pursue knowing Christ to the end of ourselves.
