***Sabbath Rest, Part 2***

**Luke 6:6-11** - On another Sabbath, he entered the synagogue and was teaching, and a man was there whose right hand was withered. <sup>7</sup> And the scribes and the Pharisees watched him, to see whether he would heal on the Sabbath, so that they might find a reason to accuse him. <sup>8</sup> But he knew their thoughts, and he said to the man with the withered hand, "Come and stand here." And he rose and stood there. <sup>9</sup> And Jesus said to them, "I ask you, is it lawful on the Sabbath to do good or to do harm, to save life or to destroy it?" <sup>10</sup> And after looking around at them all he said to him, "Stretch out your hand." And he did so, and his hand was restored. <sup>11</sup> But they were filled with fury and discussed with one another what they might do to Jesus.

I. Review the Context

**A. Jesus is Lord of the Sabbath. (6:1-5)**

Don't elevate your traditions to the level of God's Law.

**B. Jesus is our Sabbath Rest. (Hebrews 4:1-11)**

Be sure you are resting in Christ.

### **Home Group Questions**

These questions are provided for your further study and application of today's sermon. Home groups meet weekly and will provide you an opportunity to review the message, and to apply it to your life personally. Also, thoughtfully writing out the answers to these questions will help to drive home the truths we are learning.

### **Large Group**

1. Was there any passage of scripture or statement in the message today that was particularly meaningful or applicable to you?

### **Small Group**

2. Read **Mark 7:9-13**. Describe in your own words the hypocrisy of the Pharisees in this passage. What are some of the traditions we hold to that supplant genuine worship? How can you make sure that your obedience to God is motivated by love for Him, rather than by pride?
3. Read **Exodus 20:3-11**. The first three commandments clearly deal with worship. It seems clear that the 4<sup>th</sup> commandment insures the time required for worship. What are steps you can take to make sure that you have adequate time for corporate worship?
4. Read **Hebrews 10:37-11:1** and **Galatians 2:20**. What does it mean to live by faith? Share an experience where you have been obedient to a command of scripture beyond your ability, and you recognize it was the power of God working in you.
