Home Group Questions

These questions are provided for your further study and application of today's sermon. Home groups meet weekly and will provide you an opportunity to review the message, and to apply it to your life personally. Also, thoughtfully writing out the answers to these questions will help to drive home the truths we are learning.

Large Group

1. Was there any passage of scripture or statement in the message today that was particularly meaningful or applicable to you?

Small Group

2. Read **1 Corinthians 1:26-31**. How would you respond to a person who has a kind of "spiritual inferiority complex" that keeps them from stepping up serve Christ and His church?
3. Read **2 Corinthians 3:4-5 and 4:7-11**. I often quote the phrase, "I can't, He never said I could. He CAN, He always said He would," to help us remember to trust Jesus's power rather than our own. How do the truths in these passages help you when you sense that making a difference for Jesus in this world is beyond your ability?
4. Read **2 Timothy 2:20-26**. As followers of Jesus we want to serve Him. According to this passage, how do we make sure we are "fit" for service? How is pursuing righteousness, faith, love, and peace, described in these verses?
5. Read **John 21:15-17**. Mindful of the context and this low point in Peter's life (after his denial of Christ), what do you learn about Christ by his repeated call for Peter to get back to feeding his flock?
