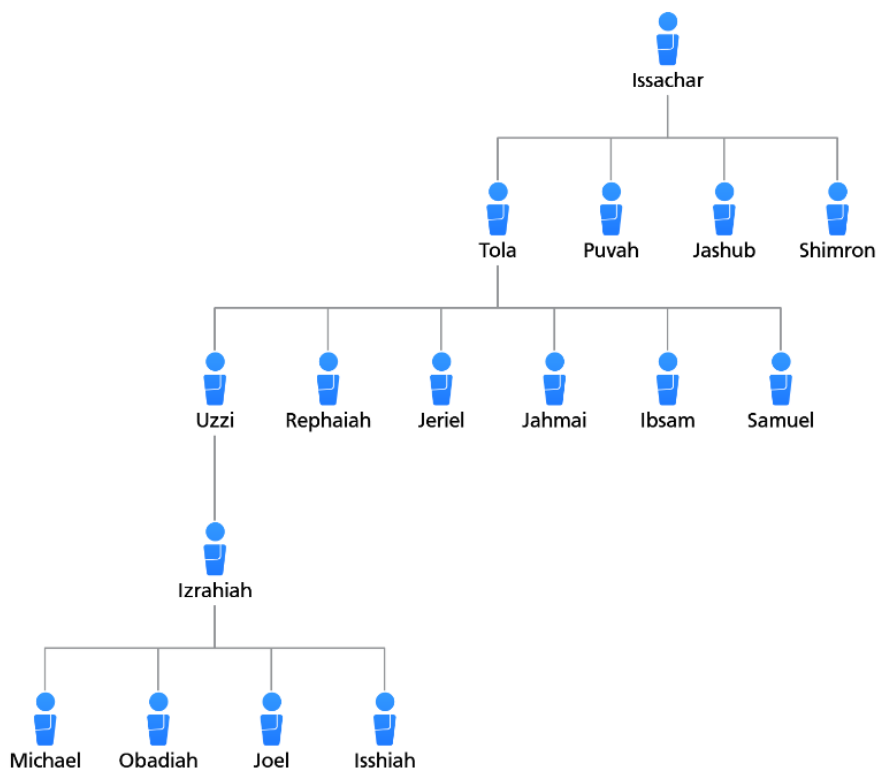
I. Valiant Men of Might – 1 Chronicles 7:1-5

chief men = high in status or authority; leaders, chiefs

valiant = strength and influence; When describing men, it can speak of those who are strong for war (Deut. 3:18; 2 Kgs. 24:16; Jer. 48:14); able to judge (Ex. 18:21, 25); or are righteous in behavior (1 Kgs. 1:52). (Warren Baker and Eugene E. Carpenter, *The Complete Word Study Dictionary: Old Testament* (Chattanooga, TN: AMG Publishers, 2003), 334.)

men of might = manly, strong, vigorous...It refers regularly to warriors, heroes, champions in battle (Warren Baker and Eugene E. Carpenter, *The Complete Word Study Dictionary: Old Testament* (Chattanooga, TN: AMG Publishers, 2003), 179.)

generations = In the plural, it is used to denote the chronological procession of history as humans shape it. It refers to the successive generations in one family (Warren Baker and Eugene E. Carpenter, *The Complete Word Study Dictionary: Old Testament* (Chattanooga, TN: AMG Publishers, 2003), 1217.)



II. Discerning Men – 1 Chronicles 12:32

that had understanding = to comprehend, discern, consider; to skillfully react to life situations (James Swanson, *Dictionary of Biblical Languages with Semantic Domains : Hebrew (Old Testament)* (Oak Harbor: Logos Research Systems, Inc., 1997).

New Treasury of Scripture Knowledge - the following words indicate, intelligent men, who understood the signs of the times, well versed in political affairs, and knew what was proper to be done. (SMITH, JEROME H.: *The new treasury of scripture knowledge: The most complete listing of cross references available anywhere- every verse, every theme, every important word.* Nashville TN : Thomas Nelson, 1992)

III. Single-Minded Men – 1 Chronicles 12:33

expert = be arranged, be put in order...take up positions, i.e., make preparations to fight by having an army line up in a certain pattern...be put in formation (James Swanson, *Dictionary of Biblical Languages with Semantic Domains : Hebrew (Old Testament)* (Oak Harbor: Logos Research Systems, Inc., 1997).

instruments = weapons

which could keep rank = to put in order. It refers to organizing a group of soldiers, of their arranging themselves in order, in battle array (Warren Baker and Eugene E. Carpenter, *The Complete Word Study Dictionary: Old Testament* (Chattanooga, TN: AMG Publishers, 2003), 809.)

not of double heart = not double minded
