

"Paul's Last Words!"

II Timothy 4:1-8

<u>Three</u> important <u>aspects</u> regarding the duties to which every minister should adhere:

The duties of a faithful minister begin with preaching. (II Tim 4:1-4)

A. Paul knew that he was <u>accountable</u> to the One before whom he would have to stand one day. (v.1; Heb 9:27)

Paul was in the presence of the Lord who is the <u>coming judge</u> of the world. (Rev 19:11-16)

Ministers must be faithful to preach the Word at all times.

- B. When is a preacher to preach? Anytime he is given the opportunity.
- C. How is he to preach?
 - 1. Faithful preaching begins with correction.
 - 2. Faithful preaching includes a word of rebuke.
 - 3. Faithful preaching should include a word of encouragement.
- D. Why a preacher must preach the whole $\underline{\text{Word}}$? (v.3-4)
 - 1. Because, if he $\underline{\text{does not}}$, the people ...
 - a. They will never hear anything about their sin!
 - They will never really be taught the <u>true gospel!</u>
 - c. They will never be taught that you must be born again!
 - d. They will never be taught that you must know Jesus!
 - e. They will never see their need for repentance!
 - 2. Churchism is perhaps the most dangerous religion in the world.

- 1. The duties of a faithful minister will involve hardship! (II Tim 4:5)
 - A. When a preacher is doing his work faithfully he will be under the assault of the enemy.
 - B. Paul commands Timothy to do <u>four things</u> and these apply today.
 - 1. A faithful minister must keep his head in all situations.
 - 2. A faithful minister must be prepared to endure hardship.
 - A faithful minister must do the work of an evangelist. (I Pet 3:15)
 - A faithful minister must <u>carry out</u> all of his responsibilities. (Acts 20:24)
- 2. The duties of a faithful minister will be <u>rewarded</u> one day. (II Tim 4:6-8)
 - A. The word <u>departure</u> has several meanings (Warren Wiersbe)
 - It means "to hoist <u>anchor</u> and set sail."
 - 2. It means "to take down your <u>tent</u>." (II Cor 5:1)
 - 3. It means "loosening a prisoner!" (I Cor 15:51-54)
 - Four things about Paul that we should all <u>emulate</u>.
 - 1. Paul fought the good fight. (I Pet 5:8)
 - 2. Paul finished the race. (I Cor 9:24-27)
 - 3. Paul kept the faith. (Heb 12:2-3)
 - 4. Paul longed to see Jesus.
