Application Questions

1. Get to know each other: When you were a kid did you have a “safe place”? What, where, or who was your “safe place”?

4. Here’s the good news: Anger can be atoned. In other words, you can be reconciled with God through a representative who dies for your guilt. How do you see that in this passage? What does this point to? How has this good news helped you tame your anger?
5. In what relationships or situations are you prone to get angry? What from our discussion will help you deal with your anger? Let’s pray for each other.
