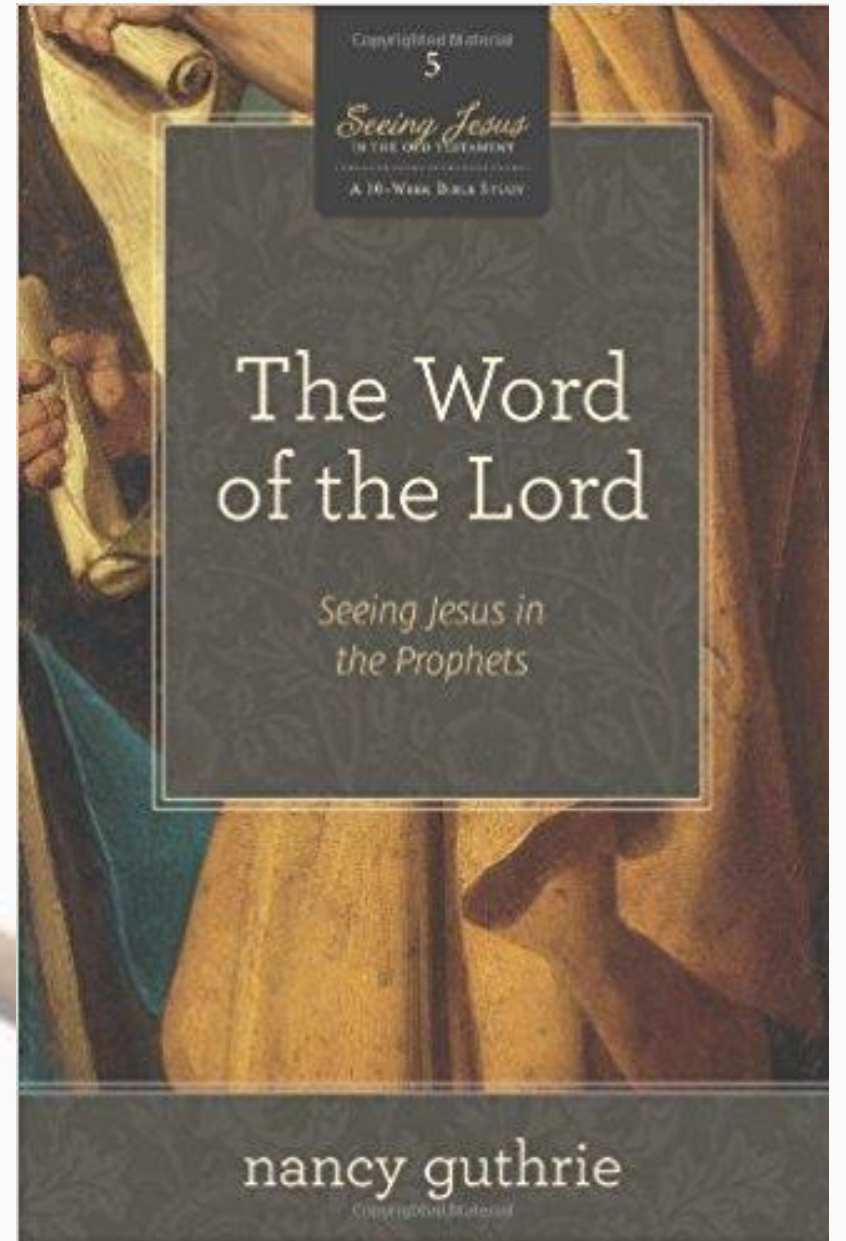
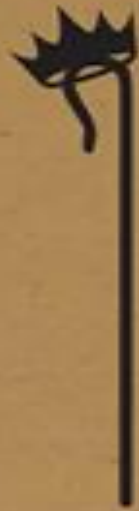

Background

- Identified by location not by family
- Prophetic call not recorded
 - 1:1 & 3:8 – is a prophet of God
- Name means “Who is like Yahweh?”
- Messenger to northern & southern kingdoms with focus on Judah
- Book of oracles
- Theme: Judgement & forgiveness. God is our Judge & Shepherd-King

- Indictments Against Israel
 - Idolatry (Samaria – 1:1-7; Judah – 1:8-13)
 - Coveting – Ch. 2
 - Results in seizure of property
 - Corrupt Leadership – Ch. 3
 - Corrupt Business practices – Ch. 6

Cycle 1: Chapters 1-2

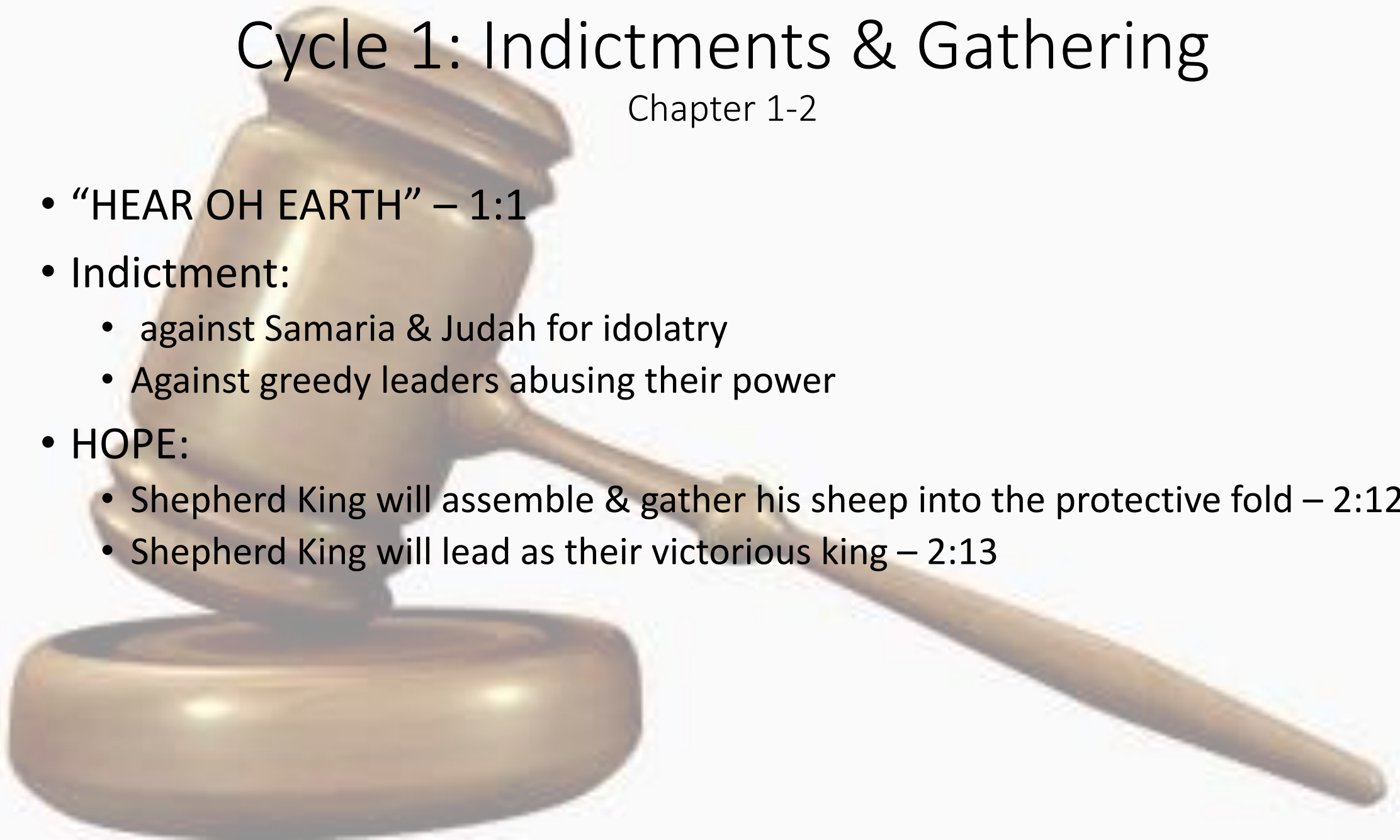
Cycle 2: Chapters 3-5

Cycle 1: Indictments & Gathering

Chapter 1-2

- “HEAR OH EARTH” – 1:1
- Indictment:
 - against Samaria & Judah for idolatry
 - Against greedy leaders abusing their power
- HOPE:
 - Shepherd King will assemble & gather his sheep into the protective fold – 2:12
 - Shepherd King will lead as their victorious king – 2:13



Cycle 2: Present Injustice & Future Just Rule

Chapters 3-5

- 3:1 – HEAR YOU RULERS
- Indictment against rulers, false prophets & priest
 - Seizing of land was not getting any justice
 - Leadership described using cannibalistic terms
 - Result of corrupt leadership led to Jerusalem's ruin-3:12
 - Built Jerusalem with injustice & violent acts so responsible for the “unbuilding” – 3:12
- HOPE:
 - Jerusalem exalted – 4:1-2 (contrast with 3:12)
 - Assemble & gather remnant like a shepherd (2:12) but also as a King (4:7)
 - Fulfilled in Jesus Christ – Chapter 5
 - Not only pleads their case but takes their punishment
 - 5:5 – *and he shall be their peace* – Ephesians 2:14

Cycle 3: Lord's Indictment & Restoration

Chapter 6-7

- HEAR – 6:1-2
 - Plaintiff: LORD
 - Accused: Israel
 - Lawyer for the Plaintiff: Micah
 - Witnesses: Mountains
- From a spiritually depraved (6:3) & disintegrating nation (7:1-7) an elected remnant will be saved (7:8-20). (Romans 11)
- 2 Questions & reminder from the Plaintiff – 6:3
 - 1st question: hits the heart of Israel's lack of trust in Him
 - 2nd question: addresses Israel's complaint against Him
 - REMEMBER: salvation of grace & faithfulness – 6:4-5
- Israel's Defense – 6:6-7
 - *Exposes an attitude that wrongly sees sacrifice as an entry fee, rather than as an avenue for God to administer grace & forgiveness to the penitent* (ESV Study Bible)



Cycle 3: RESTORATION

- Plaintiff Answer:
 - V.6 contrasted with v. 8 – Micah rejects their excuse of ignorance
 - Deuteronomy 10:12-13
- *In every age God wants his people to respond to his love by doing justice, practicing loving-kindness & walking humbly with God. This is genuine humanness, & by it Israel was called to commend God's goodness to all mankind. Israel & Judah in Micah's day were corrupted by their refusal to embrace God's purpose, & thus would suffer judgement; but there would yet be a remnant who would experience God's forgiveness & be part of his plan to bless the world through the Messiah's rule. (ESV STUDY BIBLE)*
