The Resurrection of Christ is the great demonstrating Jesus' identity and authority (John 2:18-22 and Matt 12:38-40)			
1 Corinthians 15: 12-19			
¹² But if it is preached that Christ has been raised from the dead, how can some of you say that there is no resurrection of the dead? ¹³ If there is no resurrection of the dead, then not even Christ has been raised. ¹⁴ And if Christ has not been raised, our preaching is useless and so is your			
¹⁶ More than that, we are then found to be false witnesses about God, for we have testified about God that he raised Christ from the dead. But he did not raise him if in fact the dead are not raised. ¹⁶ For if the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised either. ¹⁷ And if Christ has not been raised, your is futile; you are still in your sins.			
¹⁸ Then those also who have fallen asleep in Christ are lost. ¹⁹ If only for this life we have hope in Christ, we are to be pitied more than all men.			
Known Facts Surrounding the Death, Burial, and Purported "Resurrection" of Jesus			

- 1) Jesus died by Roman crucifixion
- 2) He was buried, most likely in a private tomb (the tomb of Joseph of Arimathea)
- 3) Soon afterward, the disciples were discouraged, bereaved, and despondent, having lost hope

- 4) Jesus' tomb was found empty very soon after his interment
- 5) The disciples had experiences which they believed were actual appearances of the risen Jesus
- 6) Due to these experiences, the disciples' lives were thoroughly transformed, to the point of being willing to die for this belief
- 7) The Resurrection message was the center of preaching in the earliest church
- 8) This message was especially proclaimed in Jerusalem, where Jesus died and was buried shortly before
- 9) As a result of this preaching the church was born and grew
- 10) Sunday became the primary day of worship
- 11) James, who had been a skeptic, was converted to the faith when he believed he saw the resurrected Jesus
- 12) A few years later, Paul became a Christian believer due to an experience which he believed was an appearance of the risen Jesus
