

Community Group Growth Questions

1. Share with the group any insight, truth, or observation from Sunday’s message that helped you, troubled you, or ministered to you.
2. What does it mean to be content? In 1 Tim. 6:6-10, how does Paul define contentment?
3. Why do you think God stipulates that contentment must be connected with godliness for great gain (v6)? In what ways is contentment related to the source of our provision? How is it related to gratitude?
4. In Philippians 4:10-13, Paul said he had learned to be content with both lack and abundance. How do we learn this lesson? What was Paul’s secret?
5. Discuss the problem with “desiring to be rich.” In what ways does it lead to ruin and destruction? Give examples.
6. Is wealth itself prohibited for the believer? Discuss Paul’s indictment against the love of money.

Living on Mission

1. Has your idea of contentment only been – “I have to learn to be happy with less”? Have you learned to also include gratitude for God’s current provision? Ask God to teach you the joy of contentment.
2. In what ways might contentment with what God has given you free you to be more generous to others? Will you? With whom?
3. Are you guilty of falling into the temptation of desiring to be rich? Has this sin brought destruction in your life? In what ways?
4. In what ways is the love of money a root of evil for you? Spend some time allowing God to examine your motives regarding wealth. How does He want you to respond?
5. Spend some time in confession and repentance. Ask God how to teach you to walk in the obedience of faith in the areas of contentment and wealth.

Missionary Toolbox: Contentment

“Paul tells us that the Christian’s goal with respect to material things is *godliness with contentment*. *Godliness* in Paul’s vocabulary means the genuine Christian life, a faith-relationship with God and a new way of life. *Contentment* is a Pauline word in the New Testament (2 Cor 9:8; compare Phil 4:11). It had a prominent place in Stoic philosophy, where it defined an attitude of “self-sufficiency,” meaning detachment or independence from things or possessions. Contentment came from within. Paul approved of this idea but naturally supplied a Christian basis for it: “I have learned to be content whatever the circumstances. . . . I can do everything through him who gives me strength” (Phil 4:11, 13). Thus for Paul the Christian goal is a genuine relationship with God, our source of contentment, and a healthy detachment from material things. This combination is *great gain*. In contrast to 6:5, *gain* here is measured according to spiritual rather than material value. Eternal benefits are surely promised, but the focus is on how the believer with this healthy perspective can avoid the many pitfalls of greed in the present life.” -- IVP New Testament Commentaries
