

Advent: The Coming of Our Savior // PEACE

If an angel of the Lord showed up right now, BOOM, and spoke, what would you want them to say? This bonafide מַלְאָךְ *mal'ak*, an ἄγγελος *ággelos*, is a messenger, an ambassador for God. I, personally, hope they start out by saying, “Fear not! Don’t be afraid!” Why? An angel of the Lord is right in front of me! But, I hope, next, they would proclaim, “Behold! Look! Be sure to see! Don’t miss this!”

In fact, in our series, “Advent: The Coming of Our Savior”, this is exactly what we see. In Luke 1:19 (ESV), starting with Zechariah, Gabriel says, “I stand in the presence of God, and I was sent to speak to you and to bring you this good news.” Of course, this good news was his son, John, who was to be born of Elizabeth, would go on to make ready God’s people and prepare the way for Jesus!

It continues with Joseph and Mary. An angel of the Lord appears to both, separately, in their dreams. The message for them from Matthew 1 and Luke 1 was similar: “Mary will bear a son, conceived from the Holy Spirit... He will be called Jesus, because He will save His people from their sins... He will be called Immanuel, God with us... He will be great and be called the Son of the Most High.”

It continues with the shepherds. In Luke 2:10-12 (ESV) an angel of the Lord says, "I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger." All of Advent, hope, love, joy, in one angelic message from God!

But, don't miss, in Luke 2:14 (ESV), when suddenly there was with the angel and the shepherds a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased!" This message is the final candle of Advent, the angel or PEACE candle. It is a message from God to us in Christ. May we all find this PEACE this DAY!

Let's pray! Lord, in Philippians 4:7 (ESV), Paul says, "The peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." Lord, this Day, we thank You for Jesus Christ. He's our Savior. He's our Immanuel, God with us. He's the Word who became flesh and dwelled among us. He's our good news of great joy. He's our Prince of Peace and Lord of Lords.

Scripture Reading

“1 In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. 2 This was the first registration when Quirinius was governor of Syria. 3 And all went to be registered, each to his own town. 4 And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the town of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, 5 to be registered with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. 6 And while they were there, the time came for her to give birth. 7 And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn. 8 And in the same region there were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. 9 And an angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with great fear. 10 And the angel said to them, ‘Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. 11 For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. 12 And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger.’ 13 And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying, 14 ‘Glory to

God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased!' 15When the angels went away from them into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go over to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has made known to us." 16And they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in a manger. 17And when they saw it, they made known the saying that had been told them concerning this child. 18And all who heard it wondered at what the shepherds told them. 19But Mary treasured up all these things, pondering them in her heart. 20And the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them." - Luke 2:1-20 (ESV)
