BBC Devotional Guide for May 28 to June 3, 2017

Sunday: Read John 17:3 and Jeremiah 9:23-24. We were created to know God. Knowing God is what life is all about. How do we get to know God? Read 2 Peter 1:2. How does knowing God produce peace in our lives? Read 2 Peter 1:3. The better you know God the more you will trust Him and the more you trust God the more you will obey Him and pursue His purpose for your life. Ask God to help you know Him better today.

Monday: Read Hebrews 4:13 and Psalm 147:5. Consider the scope of God's knowledge: God knows everything about Himself, God knows everything about creation, God knows everything about the past, the present and the future because He exists outside of time. How does the fact that God knows everything make you feel? What difference should it make in our lives that God knows everything?

Tuesday: Read Psalm 139:1-2 and Psalm 56:8. Even if no one else knows exactly what you are going through, God knows all of your thoughts and feelings. Why should this knowledge of God encourage us? Throughout the day turn to God and share your thoughts and feelings with Him.

Wednesday: God knows your failures. Read Psalm 69:5. We often try to hide our faults and failures from people and even from God. God wants us to confess our failure to Him and get up and keep moving forward in faith. Is there a failure in your life that you need to confess to God today?

Thursday: God knows your future. Read Psalm 139:16 and Jeremiah 29:11. Think about this: when you wake up in the morning God already knows everything that will happen to you that day. He knows about the traffic jam, the flat tire, the cranky boss, and everything else. Because God knows everything, ask Him for the wisdom you need to honor him today in every situation you will face.

Friday: God knows your faithfulness. Read Matthew 6:1-4. Every time you do the right thing, every time you resist temptation, every time you forgive, every time you speak a word of encouragement—God knows. Be encouraged today that God sees everything you do and your faithfulness not only brings joy to God's heart, He will also reward every act of obedience!

Saturday: God knows all of your needs. Read Matthew 6:31-32. God is a loving Father who has promised to provide everything we need to accomplish His purpose in our

lives. What do you need from God today: patience, wisdom, strength, comfort, hope, encouragement? Take some time to ask God for what you need today.
