BOOKS 1 AND 2

- **Book 1 (Psalms 1-41):** David's rise to kingship through much adversity.
- **Book 2 (Psalms 42-72):** David's reign to that of Solomon.
 - Psalms 42-49: The Sons of Korah
 - Psalms 51-71: Mostly of David
 - Psalm 72: Of Solomon
 - “The prayers of David, the son of Jesse, are ended.”

BOOK 3 (PSALMS 73-89)

- Begins with Psalm 73: the wicked prosper!
- Ends with Psalm 89: David's throne is no more!

Perplexity over Israel's decline and fall
into exile.

BOOK 4 (PSALMS 90-106)

- Begins with Psalm 90, a psalm of Moses.

Looking to the past as grounds for hope
for the future.

BOOK 5 (PSALMS 107-150)

- Begins with Psalm 107, a psalm of restoration.
- Ends with five “Hallelujah” psalms of praise.

Looking to the future with hope.

PSALM 86: STANZA 1

- 1 Incline your ear, O LORD, and answer me,
for I am poor and needy.
- 2 Preserve my life, for I am godly;
save your servant, who trusts in you—you are my
God.
- 3 Be gracious to me, O Lord,
for to you do I cry all the day.
- 4 Gladden the soul of your servant,
for to you, O Lord, do I lift up my soul.
- 5 For you, O Lord, are good and forgiving,
abounding in steadfast love to all who call
upon you.
- 6 Give ear, O LORD, to my prayer;
listen to my plea for grace.
- 7 In the day of my trouble I call upon you,
for you answer me.

PSALM 86: STANZA 2

- ⁸ There is none like you among the gods, O Lord,
nor are there any works like yours.
- ⁹ All the nations you have made shall come and
worship before you, O Lord,
and shall glorify your name.
- ¹⁰ For you are great and do wondrous things;
you alone are God.

PSALM 86: STANZA 3

- ¹¹ Teach me your way, O LORD,
that I may walk in your truth;
unite my heart to fear your name.
- ¹² I give thanks to you, O Lord my God, with my
whole heart,
and I will glorify your name forever.
- ¹³ For great is your steadfast love toward me;
you have delivered my soul from the depths
of Sheol.

PSALM 86: STANZA 4

- ¹⁴ O God, insolent men have risen up against me;
a band of ruthless men seeks my life,
and they do not set you before them.
- ¹⁵ But you, O Lord, are a God merciful and gracious,
slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love
and faithfulness.
- ¹⁶ Turn to me and be gracious to me;
give your strength to your servant,
and save the son of your maidservant.
- ¹⁷ Show me a sign of your favor,
that those who hate me may see and be put to
shame
because you, LORD, have helped me and
comforted me.

PSALM 86 FOR US

- God is a gracious master.
- Our gracious master will intervene in our day of trouble.
- A model for seeking God's deliverance:
 - Evaluate, repent, recommit.
 - Dwell on God's goodness.
 - Remind yourself of the big picture.
 - Ask first for your *spiritual* needs.
 - Ask God's intervention in your temporal situation.
