<p>Deuteronomy 24:1 "When a man takes a wife and marries her, and it happens that she finds no favor in his eyes because he has found some uncleanness in her, and he writes her a certificate of divorce, puts <i>it</i> in her hand, and sends her out of his house, ² "when she has departed from his house, and goes and becomes another man's <i>wife</i>, ³ "if the latter husband detests her and writes her a certificate of divorce, puts <i>it</i> in her hand, and sends her out of his house, or if the latter husband dies who took her as his wife, ⁴ "then her former husband who divorced her must not take her back to be his wife after she has been defiled; for that <i>is</i> an abomination before the LORD, and you shall not bring sin on the land which the LORD your God is giving you <i>as</i> an inheritance.</p>	<p>1. God Protects A Person's _____ Pledge – root is "to bind" Exodus 22:26-27 ²⁶ "If you ever take your neighbor's garment as a pledge, you shall return it to him before the sun goes down. ²⁷ "For that <i>is</i> his only covering, it <i>is</i> his garment for his skin. What will he sleep in? And it will be that when he cries to Me, I will hear, for <i>I am</i> gracious.</p>
<p>⁷ " If a man is found kidnapping any of his brethren of the children of Israel, and mistreats him or sells him, then that kidnapper shall die; and you shall put away the evil from among you.</p>	<p>4. <p>¹⁷ " You shall not pervert justice due the stranger or the fatherless, nor take a widow's garment as a pledge. ¹⁸ "But you shall remember that you were a slave in Egypt, and the LORD your God redeemed you from there; therefore I command you to do this thing. ¹⁹ " When you reap your harvest in your field, and forget a sheaf in the field, you shall not go back to get it; it shall be for the stranger, the fatherless, and the widow, that the LORD your God may bless you in all the work of your hands. ²⁰ "When you beat your olive trees, you shall not go over the boughs again; it shall be for the stranger, the fatherless, and the widow. ²¹ "When you gather the grapes of your vineyard, you shall not glean <i>it</i> afterward; it shall be for the stranger, the fatherless, and the widow. ²² "And you shall remember that you were a slave in the land of Egypt; therefore I command you to do this thing.</p>	<p>9. God Desires Israel to _____ the Stranger, the Fatherless and the Widow Exodus 22:21-24 ²¹ " You shall neither mistreat a stranger nor oppress him, for you were strangers in the land of Egypt. ²² " You shall not afflict any widow or fatherless child. ²³ "If you afflict them in any way, <i>and</i> they cry at all to Me, I will surely hear their cry; ²⁴ "and My wrath will become hot, and I will kill you with the sword; your wives shall be widows, and your children fatherless. Exodus 23:9 ⁹ "Also you shall not oppress a stranger, for you know the heart of a stranger, because you were strangers in the land of Egypt.</p>
<p>Deuteronomy 25:1 "If there is a dispute between men, and they come to court, that <i>the judges</i> may judge them, and they justify the righteous and condemn the wicked, ² "then it shall be, if the wicked man deserves to be beaten, that the judge will cause him to lie down and be beaten in his presence, according to his guilt, with a certain number of blows. ³ "Forty blows he may give him <i>and</i> no more, lest he should exceed this and beat him with many blows above these, and your brother be humiliated in your sight.</p>	<p>10. God Instructs Concerning _____ Exodus 22:8-9 ⁸ "If the thief is not found, then the master of the house shall be brought to the judges <i>to see</i> whether he has put his hand into his neighbor's goods. ⁹ " For any kind of trespass, <i>whether it concerns</i> an ox, a donkey, a sheep, or clothing, <i>or</i> for any kind of lost thing which <i>another</i> claims to be his, the cause of both parties shall come before the judges; <i>and</i> whomever the judges condemn shall pay double to his neighbor. Exodus 23:6-7 ⁶ " You shall not pervert the judgment of your poor in his dispute. ⁷ "Keep yourself far from a false matter; do not kill the innocent and righteous. For I will not justify the wicked.</p>

God Allows the Worker to _____ 1 Corinthians 9 ⁹ For it is written in the law of Moses, "You shall not muzzle an ox while it treads out the grain." Is it oxen God is concerned about? ¹⁰ Or does He say <i>it</i> altogether for our sakes? For our sakes, no doubt, <i>this</i> is written, that he who plows should plow in hope, and he who threshes in hope should be partaker of his hope. ¹¹ If we have sown spiritual things for you, <i>is it</i> a great thing if we reap your material things? 1 Timothy 5:17-18 ¹⁷ Let the elders who rule well be counted worthy of double honor, especially those who labor in the word and doctrine. ¹⁸ For the Scripture says, "You shall not muzzle an ox while it treads out the grain," and, "The laborer <i>is</i> worthy of his wages."</p>

<p>⁵ " If brothers dwell together, and one of them dies and has no son, the widow of the dead man shall not be <i>married</i> to a stranger outside <i>the family</i>; her husband's brother shall go in to her, take her as his wife, and perform the duty of a husband's brother to her. ⁶ "And it shall be <i>that</i> the firstborn son which she bears will succeed to the name of his dead brother, that his name may not be blotted out of Israel. ⁷ "But if the man does not want to take his brother's wife, then let his brother's wife go up to the gate to the elders, and say, 'My husband's brother refuses to raise up a name to his brother in Israel; he will not perform the duty of my husband's brother.' ⁸ "Then the elders of his city shall call him and speak to him. But <i>if</i> he stands firm and says, 'I do not want to take her,' ⁹ "then his brother's wife shall come to him in the presence of the elders, remove his sandal from his foot, spit in his face, and answer and say, 'So shall it be done to the man who will not build up his brother's house.' ¹⁰ "And his name shall be called in Israel, 'The house of him who had his sandal removed.'</p>	<p>12. God Gives Instruction for a _____ Marriage Ruth 4:5 ⁵ Then Boaz said, "On the day you buy the field from the hand of Naomi, you must also buy <i>it</i> from Ruth the Moabitess, the wife of the dead, to perpetuate the name of the dead through his inheritance."</p>
<p>¹¹ " If <i>two</i> men fight together, and the wife of one draws near to rescue her husband from the hand of the one attacking him, and puts out her hand and seizes him by the genitals, ¹² "then you shall cut off her hand; your eye shall not pity <i>her</i>.</p>	<p>13. God Requires _____ Behavior</p>
<p>¹³ " You shall not have in your bag differing weights, a heavy and a light. ¹⁴ "You shall not have in your house differing measures, a large and a small. ¹⁵ "You shall have a perfect and just weight, a perfect and just measure, that your days may be lengthened in the land which the LORD your God is giving you. ¹⁶ "For all who do such things, all who behave unrighteously, <i>are</i> an abomination to the LORD your God.</p>	<p>14. God Commands Fair _____ Leviticus 19:35-36 ³⁵ ' You shall do no injustice in judgment, in measurement of length, weight, or volume. ³⁶ 'You shall have honest scales, honest weights, an honest ephah, and an honest hin: I <i>am</i> the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt.</p>
<p>¹⁷ " Remember what Amalek did to you on the way as you were coming out of Egypt, ¹⁸ "how he met you on the way and attacked your rear ranks, all the stragglers at your rear, when you <i>were</i> tired and weary; and he did not fear God. ¹⁹ "Therefore it shall be, when the LORD your God has given you rest from your enemies all around, in the land which the LORD your God is giving you to possess <i>as</i> an inheritance, <i>that</i> you will blot out the remembrance of Amalek from under heaven. You shall not forget.</p>	<p>15. God Tells Israel to _____ Amalek Ex.17 Numbers 24:20 ²⁰ Then he looked on Amalek, and he took up his oracle and said: "Amalek <i>was</i> first among the nations, But <i>shall be</i> last until he perishes." ... ²³ Then he took up his oracle and said: "Alas! Who shall live when God does this? ²⁴ But ships <i>shall come</i> from the coasts of Cyprus, And they shall afflict Asshur and afflict Eber, And so shall <i>Amalek</i>, until he perishes."</p>
